Trophies to be won

Rules for Contest:

- 1. Winners of a category gain 20 seats (and a medal/trophy) for their team (Earth, Wind or Fire). No seats for second or third (first past the post!).
- 2. Winners are decided pre Assembly (assembly is results and trophy presentation).
- 3. Winner or the male and female awards gain a bonus 15 points each for their respective party.
- 4. Photographs must be made of all items produced (so that winning items can be displayed during the awards assembly on the Friday).
- 5. Items can be stored in the hall.
